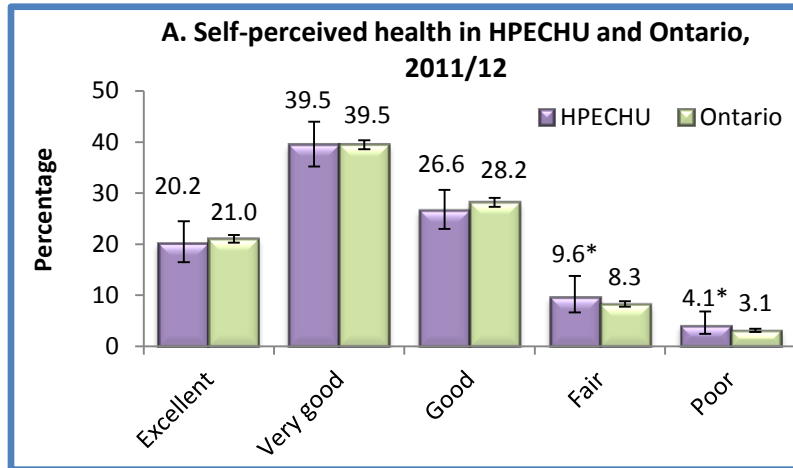
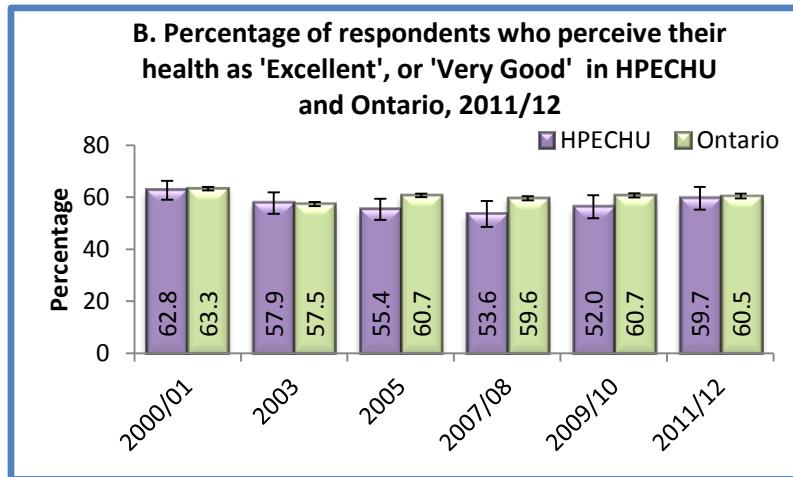

Interpretation:

Figure A: In HPECHU area and Ontario, respondents most frequently rated their health as 'very good'.

Figure B: In 2011/12 in HPECHU area, 59.7% (55.2-64.0) rated their health as 'Excellent' or 'Very Good'. The percentages of those who rate their health as 'Excellent' or 'Very Good' has been stable from 2000/01 to 2011/12.

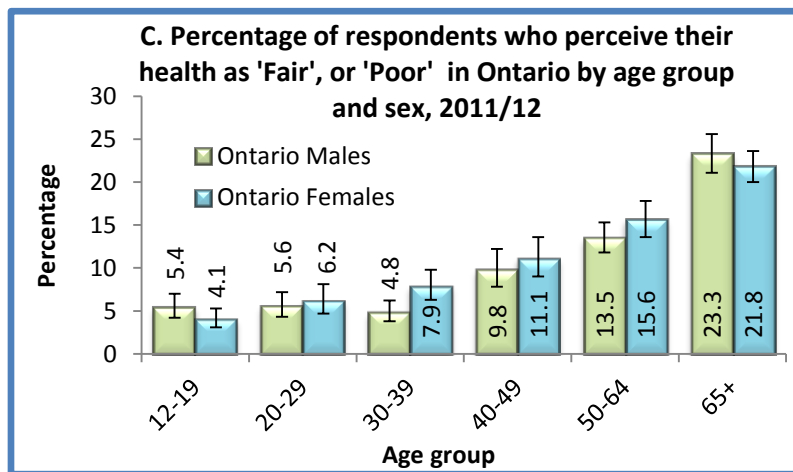
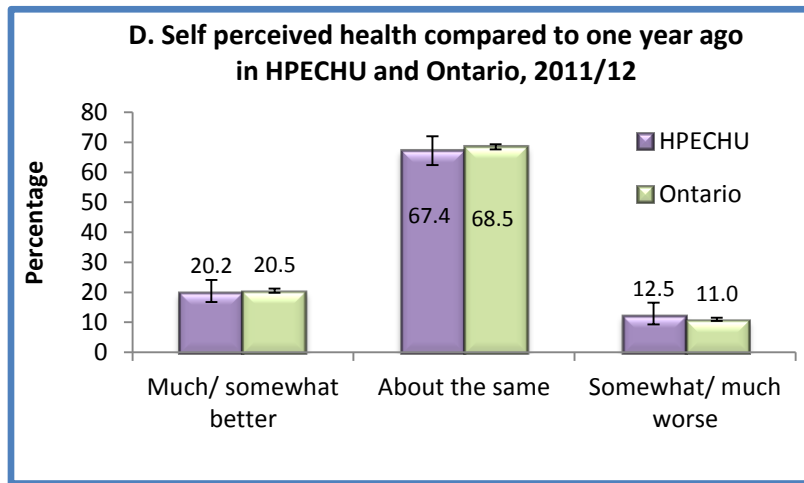


Figure C. In Ontario, the percentage of those who perceived their health as 'Fair' or 'Poor' increases with age. There were no differences between males and females in self-perceived health in most age groups. However, females aged 30-39 were more likely than males to perceive their health as 'fair' or 'poor'.

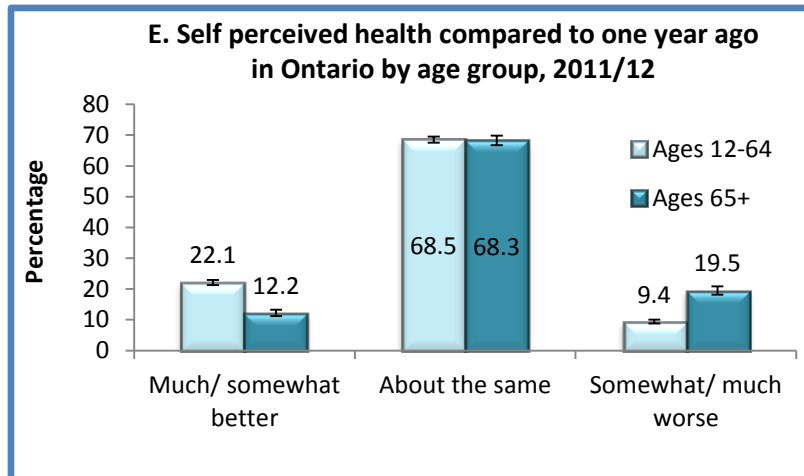

Figure E: In Ontario in 2011/12, more people aged 65+ than 12-64 rated their health as 'somewhat' or 'much worse' than the year before.

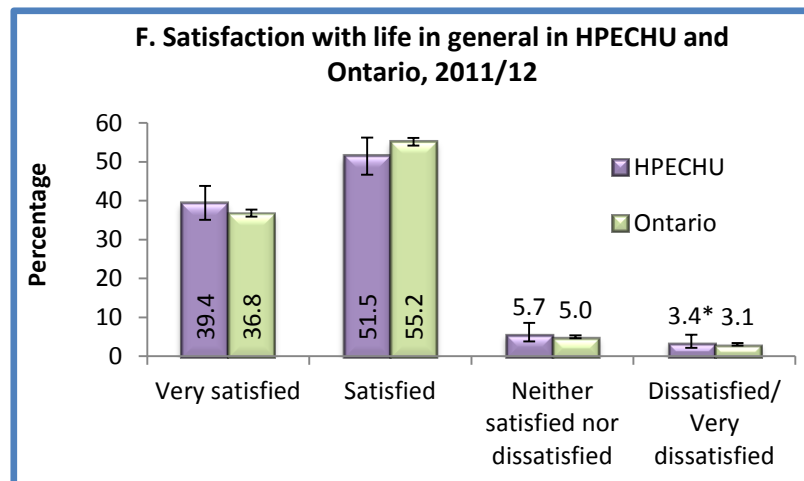
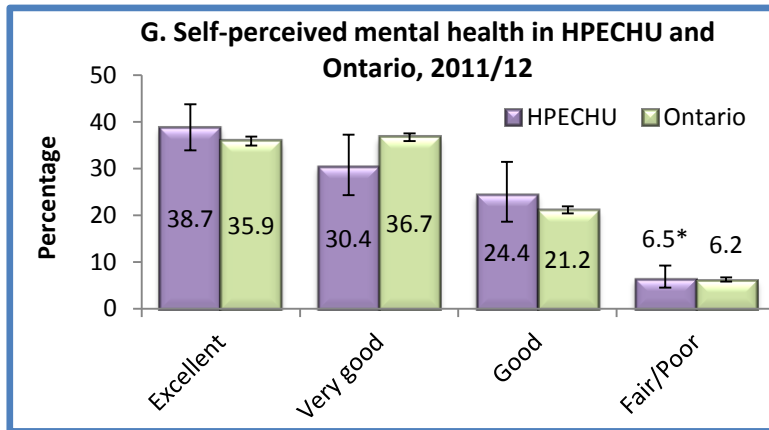


Figure F. About 90% of respondents reported being, in general, 'Very satisfied' or 'Satisfied' with life in HPECHU area and Ontario in 2011/12.

Figure G: In HPECHU area and Ontario respondents most frequently rated their mental health as 'very good'.

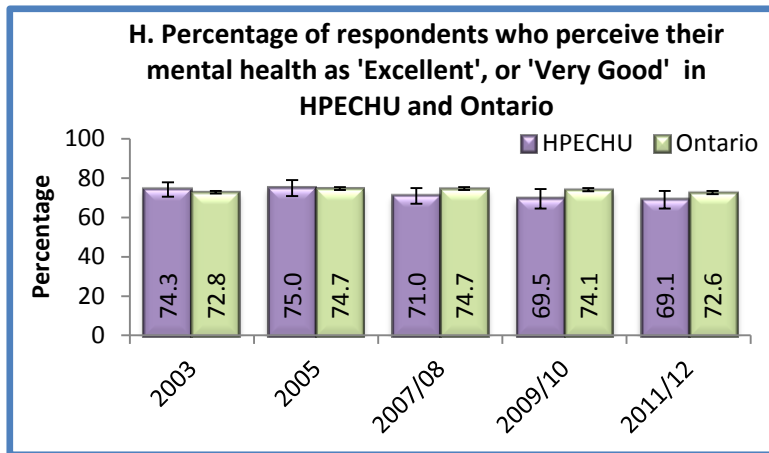

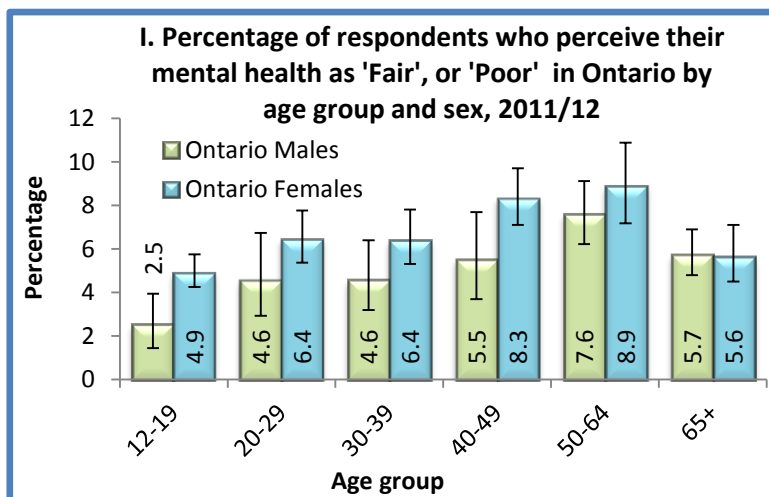
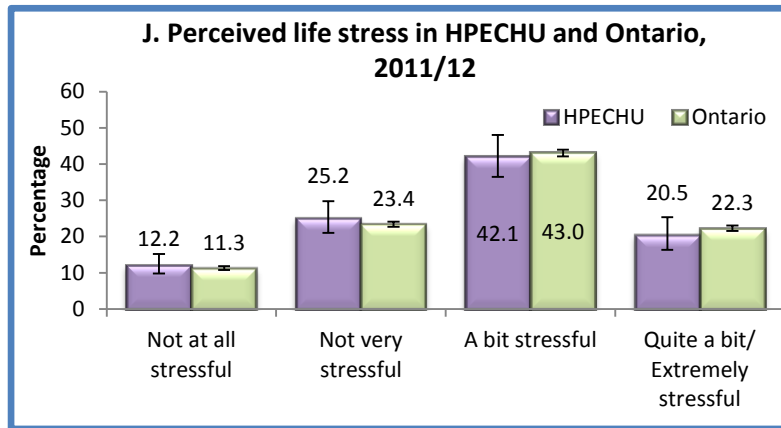

Interpretation:

Figure J: In 2011/12 in HPECHU area, about one fifth of respondents perceived their life as 'quite a bit stressful' or 'extremely stressful'.

Figure K: In HPECHU area in 2011/12, about one third of respondents perceived their worklife stress as 'quite a bit stressful' or 'extremely stressful'.

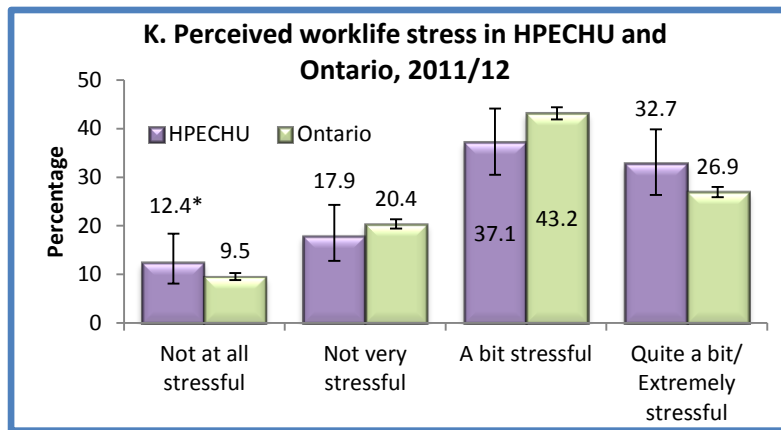


Figure L. About one fifth HPECHU area respondents, 21.7% (18.2 – 25.7), indicated they feel they have a 'very strong' sense of community belonging. Those aged 65+ have a much greater sense of community belonging than those under 65 (data not shown).
