First Influenza Cases in Hastings Prince Edward Counties

Hastings Prince Edward Public Health has received two laboratory-confirmed cases of influenza.

94% of cases reported thus far in Ontario this season are H3N2.

Influenza activity typically peaks late December every year. Since the influenza vaccine takes approximately 10-14 days to become effective, it is advisable to immunize your patients now.

Antiviral medications (Tamiflu or Relenza) are recommended for:

- Treatment of moderate, progressive, severe or complicated influenza,
- Treatment of those at high risk for complication of influenza, such as children less than 5 years of age, adults 65 years of age and over, and those with underlying medical conditions
- Treatment and prevention in influenza outbreaks in institutional settings.
