My Child/Student Did Not Pass COVID-19 Screening

Please see covid-19.ontario.ca/school-screening for details on symptoms and screening.

Does your child/student have a known cause or condition (asthma, allergies, etc.)?



Are your child/student's symptoms worse/different than normal?



Children/students with stable symptoms of a known medical condition may attend school. If there are concerns, consult your health care provider and follow their quidance.

Contact the school/child care to let them know about this result. Your child/ student should isolate (stay home) and you should contact your their health care provider for further advice or assessment, including if your child/student needs a COVID-19 test or other treatment.

Your child/student can return to child care/school if:

- They have received a negative test result OR an alternate diagnosis, AND
- The child/student does not have a fever (without using medication), AND
- It has been at least 24 hours since their symptoms started improving (48 hours after last episode of vomiting or diarrhea, if child/student experienced these symptoms).

If testing is advised and a child/student is not tested, the child/student and all household members must isolate for unless all of the following apply:

A doctor has diagnosed the child/student with another illness, AND

- The child/student does not have a fever (without using medication), AND
- The child/student student feels well enough to attend AND
- It has been at least 24 hours since their symptoms started (48 hours since last episode of vomiting or diarrhea if child/student experienced these symptoms).

Please note:

HPEPH is unable to provide clinical assessment or determine if it is suitable for a child/student to return to school or child care.

The diagnosis of another infection does not exclude the possibility of also being infected with COVID-19. Being tested will reduce the risk of unknowingly spreading COVID-19.

If testing is recommended and the child/student is tested, household members should monitor for symptoms and be tested if symptoms develop. They are not required to isolate at this time.


