CLASS ORDER

Hastings Prince Edward Public Health

Made pursuant to Section 22 (5.0.1) of the Health Protection and Promotion Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. H.7

DATE: December 15, 2021

TO: All persons residing in or present in the Counties of Hastings and Prince Edward

I, Dr. Ethan Toumishey, Acting Medical Officer of Health for Hastings Prince Edward Public Health (HPEPH), order all persons in the Counties of Hastings and Prince Edward to take the following actions, effective 12:01 a.m. on Friday, December 17, 2021:

- No person shall attend or host an indoor social gathering in a private dwelling 1. with more than 10 people, including residents of the private dwelling and social gathering attendees. For greater certainty a private dwelling includes houses, apartment buildings, condominium buildings, post-secondary student residences, trailers and cottages.
- 2. Persons responsible for hosting an indoor social gathering in a private dwelling shall maintain a list of names and contact information for guests and, upon request, provide HPEPH with this information within 12 hours of the request, or other time specified, for the purposes of COVID-19 case and contact tracing.
- 3. Persons responsible for hosting an indoor social gathering in a private dwelling shall provide HPEPH with other information regarding the social gathering as requested by HPEPH within 12 hours of the request, or other time specified, for the purposes of COVID-19 case and contact tracing.
- Comply with the requirements set out under the Reopening Ontario (A Flexible Response to COVID-19) Act, 2020 (ROA) and applicable regulations, as well as the requirements under this Order. Where this Order imposes an additional requirement not set out in the ROA, the requirement under this Order must be followed.

REASONS FOR THIS ORDER:

COVID-19 has been designated as a communicable disease under Ontario Regulation 135/18 as amended. COVID-19 has been declared a pandemic by the World Health Organization.

- COVID-19 is present in Hastings and Prince Edward Counties and therefore poses a risk to the health of the residents of Hastings and Prince Edward Counties through community transmission. The COVID-19 virus is spread from an infected person to a close contact primarily by direct contact or when respiratory secretions from the infected person enter the eyes, nose, or mouth of another person.
- 3. HPEPH case contact management investigations demonstrate nearly half of COVID-19 spread in the HPEPH region is attributed to a household setting.

I am of the opinion, on reasonable and probable grounds, that:

- a) a communicable disease exists or may exist or there is an immediate risk of an outbreak of a communicable disease in the health unit served by me; and
- b) the communicable disease presents a risk to the health of persons in the health units served by me; and
- c) the requirements specified in this Order are necessary to decrease or eliminate the risk to the health presented by the communicable disease.

I am also of the opinion that the delivery of notice of this Order to each and every member of the class is likely to cause a delay that could significantly increase the risk to the health of any person residing in the Hastings and Prince Edward Counties, so notice shall be provided through public media and the internet via posting on the hPEPH website.

NOTICE

TAKE NOTICE THAT each member of the class is entitled to a hearing by the Health Services Appeal and Review Board if the member has delivered to me and to the Health Services Appeal and Review Board, 151 Bloor Street West, 9th Floor, Toronto, Ontario, M5S 1S4, notice in writing, requesting a hearing within 15 days after publication of this Order or otherwise in accordance with applicable law.

At the time of this Order, all requests for appeal and review, submissions, materials, and inquiries must be sent to the Health Services Appeal and Review Board by e-mail to hsarb@ontario.ca or faxed to 416-327-8524.

AND TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that although a hearing may be requested this Order takes effect when it is delivered to a member of the class or brought to the attention of a member of the class.

FAILURE to comply with this Order is an offence in accordance with section 100 of the Health Protection and Promotion Act for which you may be liable, on conviction, to a fine of not more than \$5,000 for every day or part of each day on which the offence occurs or continues.
